What is the *Family-to-Family Education Program*?

Family-to-Family is a **free** 12 week education program designed to help family members understand and support their loved one living with mental illness, while maintaining their own well-being. Thousands of families describe the program as life-changing. The program is taught by trained teachers who are also family members and know that it is like to have a loved one living with mental illness.

The free course includes the following topics:

- Schizophrenia, Depression, Bipolar Disorder, Posttraumatic Stress Disorder, Borderline Personality Disorder, Anxiety & Obsessive Compulsive Disorder
- Diagnosis and critical periods
- Handling periods of crisis and relapse
- Information on medications
- Gaining empathy by understanding what a person with mental illness experiences
- Problem solving and communication techniques
- Recovery and rehabilitation
- Self-care for the caregiver; coping with worry, stress and overload
